Being A Community of Prayer in this Election Season

At the beginning of His public ministry, Jesus stood up in the synagogue of His hometown of Nazareth, and read the following text from the Book of Isaiah:

The Spirit of God is upon Me, for God has chosen Me, and sent Me to proclaim good news to the poor, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and recovery of sight to the blind, to set free the oppressed, and to announce the year of the Lord." (Luke 4:18-19)

What does it mean to be a community of His disciples in a society engaged in an election process? What roles can prayer play in our discernment of, and our active responses to, the relevance of the Gospel in our communication with one another? In the votes that we cast? In how we respond to whatever emerges from election day? Being prayerful involves such listening, being deeply attentive to and trusting fully in the presence and activity of God in the world. "Whatever our calling on behalf of the world, it must proceed from a foundational 'yes' to God, to participate in the most radical movement of all, which is the movement of God's love." (Fr Richard Rohr)

Being prayerful reminds us that we are not called to flee from the world, but to be a community of faith immersed in the world. In his recent pastoral statement, Bishop Neary put it this way, "We Christians must be a leaven in society to bring about a more just social order and to fortify the common good." Being prayerful can cultivate what Pope Francis refers to as, "a tender love of others."

"Politics must make room for love to draw near and become real. A movement that starts from our heart and reaches the eyes, the ears and the hands. Tenderness is the path of choice for the strongest, most courageous men and women." (Fratelli Tutti)

The following is a prayer that we can use for these final days of the election season, and beyond:

God of peace, these times demand a change of heart: to be, think, and act differently. Pour out your Spirit on your people as we prepare to vote. May we strive to make peace a reality by becoming agents of reconciliation, transforming and transcending polarization, misinformation, and division during this election. Help us to recognize the reality of our interconnection and interdependence and to make decisions for the common good. Amen. (Sisters of St Joseph of Peace, peaceministries.csjp.org/prayers)

Each hour begins with a short prayer, and ends with another. The rest is time for silent prayer. Eucharistic Adoration is available, as are booklets with prayers for Election Day, and the weeks and months to follow. It will also be livestreamed for those who are unable to join us in person. Soup and bread will be available in the Terrace, from 5-8 pm.

May our voting be an act of love, rooted in prayer.
