I remember going to church as a child with my family at Christmas time. Some years Christmas eve, and some years Christmas day, depending on when if fit into the busy holiday schedule. Whenever we would get to the Christmas mass, I remember looking at and admiring the manger scene. Looking at baby Jesus, his parents Mary and Joseph. I always enjoyed seeing the ceramic animals as well. Usually many camels and sheep along with the Wiseman placed in ways as to admire the new baby and the holy family.

When I went off to college I remember seeing the manger scene a little differently displayed in the Newman community. Of course being a student here, much of the Christmas season was celebrated in my home parish so I didn't have much time to ponder this new( to me) nativity scene.

This same nativity scene is the one we continue to use each year as we remember and celebrate the birth of Jesus. Maybe you have had a chance to take it all in. There is a baby Jesus, and a Mary figure. As I recall there are several other non traditional figures there as well. Regular, ordinary looking people. One man walking a dog stands out in my mind.

This beautiful set was created by a member of this community. It's very intentional design is meant to draw us into the beauty and mystery of the birth of our Lord and savior as a baby. To not only recall his birth over 2,000 years ago, but to allow us to ponder his birth in our every day life.

Each year as I gaze at this unique Christmas display in our community, it reminds me that Jesus was born so vulnerable in such a human manner. Coming into this world not as a strong and demanding leader, but as an innocent and vulnerable baby. It also reminds me of the metaphor of Jesus being born into each of our hearts, and how that might look right here in our community, not some 2,000 years ago, but right now. Jesus was born for every day people like you and me, not only for shepherds and magi who were able to visit the manger scene at his hirth.

I invite you and your family to take in the manger scene this season. Talk with your loved ones about how our manger scene is similar to many you see around the area, but also how it is slightly different. Do these differences help you to ponder the amazing beauty of the birth of our Lord Jesus? I hope the answer is yes.

As we celebrate this beautiful time of year, let us to ponder the gift of Jesus and what it might mean or look like to us, right here in this community.

### December 2024 Monthly Employee Spotlight


