Temporary Overnight Sheltering (TOS) -- a partnership with Lincoln Center

In winter, the risks to the health and life of people experiencing homelessness in the St Cloud area are so very dangerous. Faith-in-Housing, a coalition of local faith communities (including Newman) and other community organizations is working with Homeless Helping Homeless/Lincoln Center to provide overnight shelter for those whom HHH/LC cannot because of limited space. Place of Hope and Salvation Army also house people and there is still need of more space.

Our parish will be providing overnight shelter in our Terrace from Sun, Dec 22nd, through Sat, Jan 4th. HHH/LC screens those who will be our guests, provides them with evening and morning meals, transportation to and from our location, and paid trained staff for supervision.
