



**June 2, 2019** The Ascension of the Lord

Over the course of the past 11 months, I've been privileged to grow in relationship with the people who make Newman Center a community. There are a great many blessings I've received in my interactions with the permanent members and students who call this faith community home. Yes, in the past year there have been challenges, but our role in this larger thing called "Church" is to move forward, hold on to all Jesus taught us with both our hands, and bring the love he has shown us to all the world. Perhaps it would be unfair if I claimed the call to serve the Newman Center was met solely with sheer joy. I expected the transition would be challenging and perhaps even uncomfortable. But, week after week, it has been a gift to celebrate the Eucharist with you. In the breaking of the bread we remember how Jesus, in order to share his very self with all of us, had to first be broken. It is this broken bread, in which the true presence of Jesus resides, which unifies our community to worship the God who calls us in love to share love with one another.

This past year I was sent to Austin, TX for a conference on Continuing Education for Clergy. Besides running into great music, I also met interesting people from around the country. One of those people was a representative from St. Luke's Institute, a facility that offers evaluation and treatment programs for clergy and consecrated religious who are in need of healing. In discussing with him about our Diocese and Parish, he recommended I be in touch with the President of St. Luke's institute, Fr. David Songy. Fr. David is a priest of the Capuchin order and trained psychologist. In communicating with Fr. David, I found he was filled with hope and very articulate. More importantly, he was concerned with bringing healing to all of the members of our Church who struggle with the difficulty of clergy abuse. In listening to him, I chose to ask him to present a day of continuing education to the clergy of this diocese. He has graciously accepted an invitation to come to our diocese to spend a day speaking to our priests. He also agreed to spend an evening with our community. On June 25 at 7pm in the Terrace he will give us a presentation on hope and healing, followed by a discussion facilitated by Newman Member, Mela Finn. I invite all permanent members and students to join us as we endeavor to continue being a community where hope and healing are possible through the saving love of God.
