## A Pilgrimage

On October 9th a group of 24 members of the parish, students from SCSU, and a few other guests will board a flight for a pilgrimage to Italy for the Canonization of John Henry Newman. While on pilgrimage, it is traditional to pray for others' intentions as we visit the holy sites where millions of pilgrims over the centuries have prayed for God's grace in our world. When my mother was alive and struggling, my sister and I would light a candle for her in every Church we visited. Even after she died, we continued the tradition and it has been memorable to think of all the Churches where we have lit candles in her memory.

We know there are so many students and members of this community who are unable to join us on this pilgrimage. We will carry you with us in our prayers. In addition, we invite you to write any intentions you have on a piece of paper and put them in the pilgrimage prayer box in either lobby. We will bring those intentions with us and offer prayers in the Churches we visit for your intentions. In a special way as we journey, we will ask St. John Henry Newman and St. Mariam (who will also be canonized on October 13th) to pray for us.


Born in London in 1801, John Henry Newman was ordained an Anglican priest in 1825. He later founded the Oxford Movement, which emphasized the Catholic roots of Anglicanism. After a series of clashes with Anglican bishops made him a virtual outcast from the Church of England, he joined the Catholic Church at the age of 44 and was ordained a Catholic priest in 1846. Pope Leo XIII made him a cardinal in 1879 while respecting his wishes not to be ordained a bishop. The theologian and poet died in 1890, and his sainthood cause was opened in 1958. Pope Benedict XVI beatified him in Birmingham, England in 2010.

*Also being Canonized on October 13:*

The British theologian will be canonized during a Mass at the Vatican along with a Swiss laywoman, an Indian nun, an Italian nun, and a nun known as the "Mother Teresa of Brazil." Blessed Mariam Thresia (1876-1926) is commemorated in the church on June 8th. She is one of the modern manifestations of sanctity in our church. From the very beginning of her life she interiorized the suffering of Jesus. In later life she is credited with mystical experiences that deepened her spirituality further. For some time she lived with the sisters who were willing to receive her. But in 1913, she began to live in a prayer house at Puthenchira with the blessing of Bishop. It was later made into a convent dedicated to the Holy Family. Mariam Thresia, along with three others, made their profession of religious vows and were invested with the habit. On May 14, 1914, the congregation of the Holy Family was founded.

Blessed Mariam and Fr. Jose, who serves at the Cathedral in St. Cloud, are both from Kerala, India.


